Today's Mission Moment

Ruthie Wagner, from Lutheran Bible Translators is here **today** to share about some of her recent work in Bible translation. She will be sharing more at **9:30am in the Fellowship Hall**. (Bible Study will resume next week.) Everyone is invited to attend.

Ruthie is a Translation Advisor and Exegete working with translation programs in Tanzania, particularly with the Kerewe Bible Translation Program, located on Ukerewe Island on Lake Victoria. Ruthie primarily works remotely from Minnesota and travels to Tanzania a couple of times a year for workshops. She teaches and trains Bible translators using technologies such as YouTube, Zoom, and WhatsApp. Ruthie also serves as the Archive Curator for Lutheran Bible Translators.

Ruthie is a third-generation missionary and grew up in Bangladesh. At Bible school, God called her to love people by giving them His Word in the languages they know best, just like He had done for her. Ruthie met her husband Josh at a Bible translation meeting and they married in 2009. From 2013-2020, they worked with Bible Translation and Scripture Engagement in Sierra Leone. Josh now works as the Business Manager for the LCMS Minnesota South District. They have four children.

"We are fighting both physical and spiritual poverty," says Rev. Peter Kirby.

Quilting Ministry

Originally began as a part of the LWML, the quilters are a group of caring individuals who meet the 2nd and 4th Thursdays at 9:00am. Beautiful quilt tops are created, the quilters add backing and batting and tie the quilts together and then they are bound. The quilts are given to individuals and organizations who need the love of Christ and the warmth a quilt will provide.

So far this year, 32 quilts have been lovingly made and were given to Phil's Friends and Orphan Grain Train. LERT Training

The LERT (Lutheran Early Response Team) model will be presented to prepare congregations and individuals to be better prepared when a disaster strikes and help them know how to respond. Participants will learn how to develop local teams of trained volunteers to respond when disasters occur. Congregations are encouraged to send a group of people to this training for ready application when you get back home.



Anyone interested is welcome to attend the training session. However, only LCMS members who are 14 years or older will receive qualification as LCMS LERT volunteers. You will receive your certificate of participation, volunteer ID card and T-shirt after the training is complete. Your LERT trainers will distribute all the LERT materials during and after the class.

The three main sections of the training are: 1) An introduction to the LCMS Disaster Response program, 2) Congregational Preparedness and 3) Lutheran Early Response Teams.

The training is on **Saturday, October 26 at Trinity Lutheran Church in Faribault from 9:00-3:00pm.** Please come at 8:30am to check-in, complete registration & pick up materials. The LERT training class begins at 9:00 am. **(Laurie B has registered and would love to take a car load of people along!)**

Advanced registration is required online (scan the QR code). Your early registration is greatly appreciated by event planners. Walk-ins are welcome but cannot be guaranteed classroom materials.



Cost is \$20 per person (includes all materials, refreshments, and lunch). Pay at the training with cash or check only.

Mission Updates ... Hurricane Helene

Samaritan's Purse

We are providing relief in the mountains of **Watauga County, North Carolina**—home to Samaritan's Purse international headquarters in the town of Boone. This response extends to include neighboring counties in North Carolina (Ashe, Avery) and eastern Tennessee (Johnson).

Southwest of Boone, rivers also raged outside their banks causing widespread destruction in the **Asheville, North Carolina**, area. Long stretches of interstate artery I-40 are shut down, after sections washed out. Our response there is focused on Buncombe County, which includes Asheville, Black Mountain, Montreat, and Swannanoa.

We have deployed a 20-bed Emergency Field Hospital—designed as an emergency room triage unit—at Cannon Memorial Hospital in the town of Linville (Avery County). The facility, requested by the Appalachian Regional Health System/UNC Health System, is staffed by our Disaster Assistance Response Team (DART) medical personnel.

Many communities in the High Country of North Carolina and far eastern Tennessee are cut off by damaged roads, downed trees, and flooding. Samaritan's Purse is coordinating air relief to some of these locations—delivering basic necessities to those in dire straits using our own helicopter as well as the aircraft of other organizations. We are working through various local contacts, including our Operation Christmas Child partner churches, to identify those who are suffering and then to respond as requested. We praise God we have been able to deliver much food, water, and other relief to those isolated by the storm.

Samaritan's Purse also has two U.S. Disaster Relief bases in Florida and one in Georgia. We have one response site in **Perry, Florida**, where the storm made landfall with 140-mph winds along the Big Bend. Helene hit there late on Sept. 26 at Category 4 strength, making it the strongest storm to hit the area in recorded history. Our Perry base is at Calvary Baptist Church. We are also responding in greater **Tampa, Florida**, where thousands of homes have been flooded. At this site, we are being supported by our Canadian affiliate office.

Day and overnight volunteers started Sept. 30 in all locations. You can find more details about all our responses and how you can volunteer at spvolunteer.org. Please prayerfully consider serving as many volunteers will be needed to serve as the hands and feet of Jesus Christ to help the hurting.

Lutheran Church Charities

Lutheran Church Charities (LCC) is calling on its supporters to pray for families and individuals affected, as well as LCC's preparations to serve the Florida-Georgia, Southeastern, and Mid-South districts of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod (LCMS) and Lutheran Early Response Teams (LERT) participating in recovery efforts.

"We know that so many lives have been upended and torn apart. They are entering this week without loved ones, homes, power, and basic needs. They need our prayers right now." Singer said. "As the waters recede and power is restored, LCC stands ready to offer emergency assistance, tangible support, and most importantly, the comfort and hope found only in Jesus Christ."

LCC is able to provide this assistance because of faithful, generous donors and volunteers who are willing to support and serve. "The financial support you can offer right now will go directly to helping families and LCMS congregations across the region affected by Helene," Rev. Chris Singer said.

Time to Revive

Revive Mankato—On July 26-27 Anne Benson and I were invited to participate and help train the Love Mankato outreach. The leader, Eli Powell has been doing ministry in Mankato for a few years along with a team he's been equipping to help him.

Carver County Fair—In August we had a prayer and Gospel booth again at the Carver County Fair for five days. We were blessed to have 29 volunteers, many of them from various Christian Churches. We gave away around 250 Revive Bibles, many youth and children's Bibles and adult devotionals. Several volunteers had not done outreach in this way before but they jumped in and joyfully shared the Gospel.

Shangri-La New Age Festival—On Aug. 31 - Sept. 1 I participated with Streetlevel ministry at the new age and hippy festival at Harmony Park in southern Minnesota. We had a Prayer Station and offered prayer, Bibles and other resources presenting the Gospel message. We offered free meals, water and snacks. Streetlevel has been doing the Prayer Station twice a year since 2009 and many of the fair-goers expressed appreciation for us being there and sharing God's love.

Every Day Opportunities—These young Hispanic men from South America were installing a fiber optic cable on my street earlier this summer. I sensed the Lord nudging me to give them some cold water and fizzy drinks and also Spanish Bibles. I found one who spoke a little bit of English. They gladly accepted the drinks and Bibles. Please pray that the seven men will read the Bible and come to saving faith.

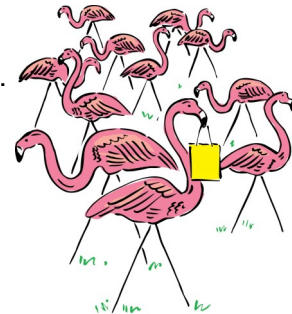
Youth Fundraiser
